As usual, the Committee have assisted in arranging the Annual Reunion Weekend. For those who don't know when the University stepped down from assisting in arrangements for the weekend a few years ago an unofficial body called the Bristol Alumni Network (BAN) was formed consisting of a representative (normally the Chair/ Head honcho) of a Hall Association, Alumni Branch or a University Society. So about 17 of us have created a sub-group to organise the weekend.

For those who have never gone to a reunion weekend before this is a chance to meet other alumni (maybe arrange a group of you who were in Hall together?) and rediscover parts of Bristol; there are several visits and these are highlighted in the advert for the weekend further on in this newsletter. To reconnect with Churchill Hall you can even stay in the Holmes- the historic house, now part of Churchill - surrounded by the beautiful Botanic Gardens (entry is free for alumni). The centre piece of the weekend is dinner at a Stoke Bishop Hall. This year unfortunately Churchill is not available (Uni hired out for Conference) but perhaps next year. I stress the dinner is open to all whether you were in Hall or even if not, and there is a discount for recent grads.

One new event we are thinking of is a reasonably priced dinner in a London pub in the winter. If this is successful we could extend this to other large UK cities where there are Churchillians.

## Charity Rugby Match, April 2024

In 2019, James Johnson (Wills Hall 2019-20) started planning a charity rugby match to be played between Wills Hall and Churchill Hall. He decided to support the Ted Senior Foundation, a charity set up in memory of a former graduate of Bristol who had moved to Swansea University and had sadly taken his own life in 2018. This inspired his family to set up a charity to improve mental health support and suicide prevention ([www.thetedseniorfoundation.org](http://www.thetedseniorfoundation.org)).

Discussions ensued between the associations of Wills and Churchill Hall and these resulted in CHA agreeing to purchase a cup to mark the occasion and to be presented to the winning team. The inaugural match was planned for late March 2020 but for understandable reasons wasn't played until James was a final year undergraduate. The match was a victory to Churchill Hall, as was the subsequent year's match.

The third game took place this year on Friday 26 April 2024 at Coombe Dingle and was a draw, with Wills breaking the winning streak that Churchill had displayed for the last two years!

Many thanks to Issie Phillips, Alex Sedgeley, Oli Percival, Ruby Chatfield, Max Dombrowe, James Johnson, all the players and supporters for keeping this tradition going and raising £300 for the charity!

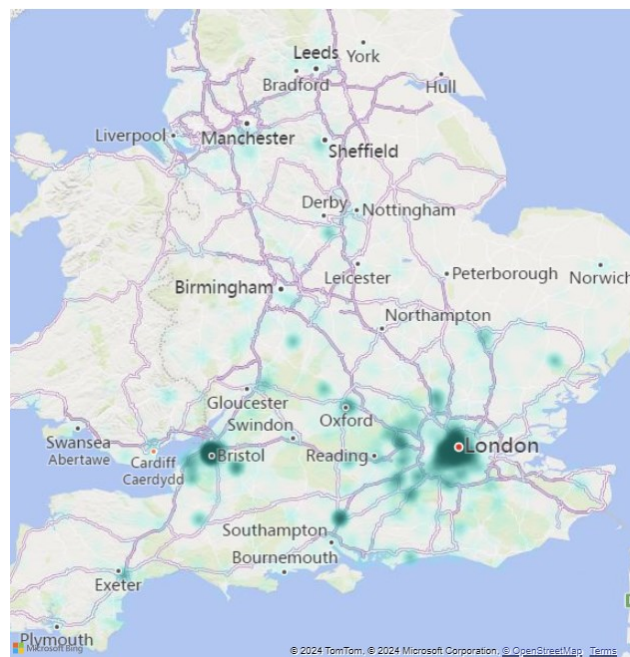


## Future Events

Anyone attending the reunion weekends over the past few years will have noticed that attendance is declining, a total of 53 for the combined reunion meal in 2023 including university staff, partly because our membership is becoming increasingly elderly and so are either unable or unwilling to travel, and because we have been unsuccessful in recruiting younger members.

Furthermore, the rooms within the Holmes that we have enjoyed the use of for a number of years are no longer available to us and this has forced us to attend a combined event with Wills Hall.

Thus I believe we need to rethink the nature and location of our reunion event and as a starting point we approached Sarah Price to see if the University could plot where the Churchill Alumni were based. Thus the 'heat map' below which uses shades of green to illustrate where alumni are based; the darker the colour, the more concentrated the alumni in that area.



Perhaps unsurprisingly the majority of Churchill Alumni for which the University has contact details, are concentrated around London, and then around the South-West (which is in line with the pattern of our UK alumni generally).

## Finance Update

### Finances to 31 March 2024

The year has been relatively inactive in financial terms. The main reason for this is that the Alumni Network Group who are responsible for organising the Reunion Weekend decided that the sensible approach was that, as the transactions for the Weekend were being handled through the WHA account, any surplus or shortfall would be held there and carried forward to the next year.

This means that the only "activity" costs during the year under review were those relating to the maintenance of the website, totalling £101.75 (some of these relating to a period of longer than one year). The charges relate only to ongoing costs for the hosting of the website (and the various additional facilities required to operate it) – there are no costs for building and maintaining it (we express our thanks to Philip for doing this).

The only other cost during the year was for bank charges amounting to £60, against which can be set the interest received of £54.07.

The funds in hand at the end of the financial year totalled £3,347.50 which is considered to be a more than adequate amount to meet our financial obligations for some time to come.
